Speakers' Profiles



Pastor Nicholas Choo, an ordained minister with the Assemblies of God in Singapore, has been working with children since 1977. He has started, co-started and written many children's programmes including a six-year programme called Royal Rangers. He conducts camps, rallies, seminars and conferences for children, youths and adults. He has travelled to many countries to do so.



David Leong, Executive Director of Scripture Union Singapore, is a missionary sent out by Grace Methodist Church, Singapore since 1990. He is a licensed local preacher and has been involved in children, youth and adults for some 30 years now. He teaches part-time at Singapore Bible College, TCA College and Covenant Vision School of Ministry in the areas of Christian Education, Christian Family and Counselling.



Olga D.Irenna has been involved in Indonesia's National Children's Prayer Network as a Prayer Mobilization Facilitator since 2003. She works with many denominations in many cities to raise up facilitators for the Children Prayer Network and to train and impart children to pray. She is married to Ps. Pardamean Pasaribu and they are blessed with three children. Currently she lectures at Gunadarma University Jakarta. As a committee member of The World Prayer Assembly 2012, Olga and her team are responsible to mobilize and prepare 20,000 children to pray at Jakarta's National Stadium in May 2012.



Percy Low, Children's Ministry Staff of Charis Methodist Church, has been involved in full-time Christian ministry since 1996. Since her graduation from Trinity Theological College in Singapore in 2005, she has been actively involved in children's ministry through chaplaincy work in a mission primary school, student care centre and kindergarten as part of her church community outreach strategy as well as through Scripture Union Singapore.
